[crew laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Angela comes out like, “Dedaladah!”

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh! That couldn't of gone worse.

[studio applause]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Hello! Hi! Welcome! How are you?

ANGELA HARTNETT: I love that skipping in!

NICK GRIMSHAW: I love that skip in!

ANGELA HARTNETT: Very enthusiastic.

ANGELA SCANLON: It's like, wah-hoo! We're here! Thanks!

NICK GRIMSHAW: Come in! Come in!

ANGELA HARTNETT: Come in.

NICK GRIMSHAW: How are you?

ANGELA SCANLON: Ooh that looks-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah. Right.

ANGELA SCANLON: -delicious.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Sit down!

ANGELA SCANLON: Ricey! What do I do?

NICK GRIMSHAW: Ricey. Come in! Very ricey. Okay. Our guest is here. Shall we welcome-

NICK GRIMSHAW: -Angela's. Cheers, Angela's. Let's begin.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm. Oh, that's delicious, Nick.

ANGELA SCANLON: That is-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Lovely.

ANGELA SCANLON: -gorge.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh.

ANGELA SCANLON: You know, the Angelas is a thing in Ireland-

NICK GRIMSHAW: What thing is it?

ANGELA SCANLON: -very specific, where just before the news they play a big bong and everyone, you know, stops and blesses themselves.

NICK GRIMSHAW: No way.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Do they?

ANGELA SCANLON: It's called the Angela's.

NICK GRIMSHAW: It's called the Angela's?

ANGELA SCANLON: Angela Rippon.

ANGELA HARTNETT: And Angela Rippon yeah *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh yeah, I'm Ribbon.

ANGELA SCANLON: Absolute bad bitches convention.

[everyone laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: We're live from the Angela.

ANGELA SCANLON: Um-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Before we get into your food likes and dislikes-

ANGELA SCANLON: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -we actually should talk about the naturist convention.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh, we really should.

NICK GRIMSHAW: What the hell was this, please?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yes.

ANGELA SCANLON: So, I did a bunch of documentaries for RTE in Ireland-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -years ago. I mean, we must be talking 10 years ago now.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -kind of pop culture stuff.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: And the World Naturist Convention-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -was in Drumshanbo-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -in Leitrim, which is like not a sexy place.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: No offence to anyone from Drumshanbo.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: And but nor is naturism, as it turned out.

[everyone laughs]

ANGELA SCANLON: -it might be quite exciting. Lads-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -we arrived there, it's a very hot day. Again, doesn't happen regularly-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -in Leitrim.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: And so, everyone's just cruising around with their cups of tea, b***** out-

NICK GRIMSHAW: *[laughs]*

[crew laughs]

ANGELA SCANLON: -like, and, and sitting on fabric-covered chairs-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Ooh.

ANGELA SCANLON: -which I was like-

[crew laughs]

ANGELA HARTNETT: Ooh.

NICK GRIMSHAW: No

ANGELA HARTNETT: No.

ANGELA SCANLON: -someone like had their wedding here yesterday, you know.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: It was all in my head, I was just, I was spiralling. Anyway, they said you need to like get your kit off.

ANGELA HARTNETT: No.

ANGELA SCANLON: I was-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh my gosh.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and I thought, no.

NICK GRIMSHAW: No.

ANGELA HARTNETT: No.

ANGELA SCANLON: Like, a bit of me was kind of, I'd like to get involved in the thing. I don't want to be standing there.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, sure.

ANGELA SCANLON: I want to be involved-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and immersed in the-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -action.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: And they basically said, no, and like, they won't trust you. The whole point of being-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh my God.

ANGELA SCANLON: -a naturist-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -is that you're like, everyone's exactly-

ANGELA HARTNETT: The same.

ANGELA SCANLON: -the same.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: I mean, they're not.

ANGELA HARTNETT: No.

[everyone laughs]

ANGELA SCANLON: In theory, we're all the same. So, I was like, do you know what? This is the beginning of what I hope will be a long and illustrious career, and I don't think I should get my fanny out-

NICK GRIMSHAW: No.

ANGELA SCANLON: -on day one.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: No, no, no.

[crew laugh]

ANGELA SCANLON: So, I basically—

ANGELA HARTNETT: Good choice.

ANGELA SCANLON: Thank you. I'm really-

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: -I'm happy with that choice.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, I think you should be.

ANGELA SCANLON: But I remember having tea with them, trying to secretly do the little side-eye anyway.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh my God.

ANGELA SCANLON: And then at one point, our director, again, I'm not sure how this will age, but our director was kind of very into the documentaries feeling like intimate-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and real, kind of in the YouTube age.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yes.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: So, you wanna see right up close-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -not all perfect and polished.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: So, he's like, go closer, go closer, go closer.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh my God.

ANGELA SCANLON: And there's like a zoom in on somebody. And I was like, wow, I really don't think we're gonna be able to use that on RTÉ2 anyway. And then, as if like it was poetry in motion, a fly landed on her.

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: *[laughs]* No. Not a fly around there.

ANGELA HARTNETT: No!

ANGELA SCANLON: A fly!

NICK GRIMSHAW: No.

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: And I was like, okay, no, I'm out. I'm out.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I've gotta get out of here. Oh my God.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh God.

ANGELA SCANLON: So that was my foray into naturism.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Wow. Shall we do Angela Scanlon's food likes and dislikes.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yes.

ANGELA SCANLON: Go on.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Uh, these are kind of amazing. We've had a first, by the way.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Have you?

NICK GRIMSHAW: After like 180-odd episodes-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -we think we have our first-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh yes, definitely.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -our first mention of someone loving Turkish Delight.

ANGELA SCANLON: Shut up!

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yes.

NICK GRIMSHAW: No, no one's-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -mentioned it.

ANGELA SCANLON: Are you joking me?

NICK GRIMSHAW: Obviously-

ANGELA HARTNETT: No.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -no, because no one in the world eats it apart from you.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: That's why the Rose Garden, is it.

NICK GRIMSHAW: That's why the Rose Garden.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yes, yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Well, yeah, you said that you'd sort of loved soapy tastes.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: I do love soaps. Violet Parma-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yes.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -those sorts of things.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah, um, yeah, anything that feels kind of like fragrant.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: And I don't know whether it's like a granny kind of thing-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -like if— I don't know, it just feels kind of sophisticated-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and clean and fresh.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I know what you mean. Like, I don't love it, But I can understand that, like taste-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -sort of area, like powdery-

ANGELA SCANLON: Like lavender.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -floral.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Is that doing the job? Is this doing Turkish delight, maybe?

ANGELA SCANLON: This is doing the job. It's light on the rose I would say.

NICK GRIMSHAW: It's a little light.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: but I like-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -would love it. Like-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -like a punch in the face.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Crank up the rose.

ANGELA HARTNETT: But do you like them florally, like herbs and stuff like coriander, tarragon, that sort of thing?

ANGELA SCANLON: All of them.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, you've got it.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: So, you've got that, right.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: But I do love, it's also the texture.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: So, the rose is one thing, but it's the, it's the jelly.

NICK GRIMSHAW: The jelly.

ANGELA HARTNETT: The jelly bit, okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: Like marshmallow. The whole family. So, you've got Turkish, you got marshmallows, you got jelly.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: All of them, all of them all at once.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Because didn't you eat, as a kid, jelly from the packet?

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: I did, yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: I love that.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, I used to eat cubes of it, 'cause I sort of loved it, but too young to make it.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah, okay.

NICK GRIMSHAW: So, I'd be like, this'll do it.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Just eat it, yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Just do it. Eat it raw.

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: It works.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Another thing that you loved is tahini. You said that you'd drink it for breakfast.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]*

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: I mean. Wow. Uh-

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: Bring it on, bring the pint of tahini on.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[gulp noises]* Also, not really that-

ANGELA HARTNETT: It's not drinkable.

NICK GRIMSHAW: No not drinkable.

ANGELA SCANLON: -nice to drink.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, quite thick.

ANGELA SCANLON: But I do like tahini.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yes, good taste.

ANGELA SCANLON: Again, I think it makes me feel sophisticated, but I also like sesame seeds-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Okay right.

ANGELA SCANLON: -sesame oil, anything in that family.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, got it.

ANGELA SCANLON: Love.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: You say that you love brown bread, Irish soda bread, but always toasted.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Always toasted.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Always toasted.

ANGELA SCANLON: I never liked bread.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And then you said, actually, I don't like bread, I like toast.

ANGELA SCANLON: Thank you.

NICK GRIMSHAW: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]* Sorry, I should have just edited that.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, I don't like bread, I like toast.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: And I've always been like that. Thanks for asking.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: Have you always been like that?

[everyone laughs]

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: I don't know. Again, I think it's a texture thing. I'm like, also my mom used to do sandwiches for us as kids.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: I have 3 sisters. We'd have them in cling film and sent in your school bags. And I was like; this is not for me.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Would it kill you to toast it?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Honestly, I just—

ANGELA HARTNETT: Feels lighter when it's toasted.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, it does.

ANGELA HARTNETT: It doesn't feel so heavy. I always used to believe that it had less calories if you toasted it. *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: Does it?

ANGELA HARTNETT: I dunno where they went.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I always thought—

ANGELA SCANLON: Does it not?

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

[crew laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: I feel like it does.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, course it does.

ANGELA SCANLON: It feels that way.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: It feels it should.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: In the same way that like melted cheese, feels worse for you.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yes, I know what you mean-

NICK GRIMSHAW: 'Cause that feels bad.

ANGELA SCANLON: 'Cause you can literally see the-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Fat coming out.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, whereas like non-melted cheese-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, they feel-

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -is like, yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Sophisticated. Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: You'll take-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -it knowingly.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Um, your other loves continue, um, seafood generally.

ANGELA SCANLON: Ge- *[laughs]*

ANGELA HARTNETT: Generally.

NICK GRIMSHAW: But you don't love the hard work connected to it.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Is that the cooking or the eating?

ANGELA SCANLON: It's the eating.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: I don't like, like if I get shellfish, and look, this is only ever if I'm on holidays-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -or I'm out, I don't wanna have to hack away with that bloody yolk.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Me neither.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Like I want it, even though-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Out of the shell, done for you, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: And sometimes I feel like-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Food admin.

ANGELA SCANLON: -a cheat. Food admin.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: And I used to do it. I'm like, yeah, yeah, yeah, I can handle it. What the f*** is that yolk?

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: And I'd be like, where exactly-

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: -am I poking this-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -very thin little prong?

NICK GRIMSHAW: Uh-huh.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: And then I realised that I ate this s*** pipe of a prawn.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh yeah

ANGELA SCANLON: You know what I mean?

NICK GRIMSHAW: It is tough, yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: You don't wanna do that.

NICK GRIMSHAW: You don't wanna do that.

ANGELA HARTNETT: No.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I do think that respectfully it's the chef's job.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, that's fair enough.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Respectfully. Uh, you also love fish and chips, mushy peas-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -vinegar cheese toastie, seaweed. You love-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -um, your dad used to eat dulse?

ANGELA SCANLON: Dulse.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Dulse.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah, yeah. But you, you said it the way it's spelled.

NICK GRIMSHAW: D-U-L-S-E.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: What's dulse?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Seaweed.

ANGELA SCANLON: Seaweed.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh, it's seaweed.

ANGELA SCANLON: But it's like wild Atlantic seaweed-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh.

ANGELA SCANLON: -so it's like really salty.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Ribbony.

ANGELA SCANLON: Ribbony-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -ribbony, and sometimes a bit clumped-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and it's like dark black kind of-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -um, and yeah, I just remember the smell. He'd have a pack of it in his car, and that would be a kind of thing that he'd snack on.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: And I had cousins who did it afterwards, and it was— and if we'd ever go to Mayo, to my dad's place, we'd come back with bags full of dulse and boxty, which is like a potato cake kind of—

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Okay. Right.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, love a potato cake.

ANGELA SCANLON: Love a potato cake.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Love potato cake.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: While you finish the dislikes, I'm going-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Okay.

ANGELA HARTNETT: -I'm going to go and get some food.

NICK GRIMSHAW: This is one we've also never had on Dish before. You say you love, you're not into actual meat, but the skins of meat.

ANGELA SCANLON: The skin. Is this why you gave me pork scratchings?

NICK GRIMSHAW: This is why we gave you pork scratchings.

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay, yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: So, the skins of meat.

ANGELA SCANLON: The skins of meat. So, we will-

NICK GRIMSHAW: So, talk me through it. *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Talk me through it.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]* We'll like cook a Sunday roast.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yes.

ANGELA SCANLON: Everyone else will have the chicken.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: And I will take all of the skin off the chicken.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Put it back in the air fryer on max crisp, and that's me.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh wow. That's obviously-

ANGELA SCANLON: Filthy.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Delicious.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Delicious.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah, same with like any pork.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Not a massive-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -fan of pork, but like the rind, is that what you'd call it?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Thank you.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Skin of the pork.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Skin, okay. Again, crisp that up-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -spoonfuls of-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -apple sauce-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -in.

NICK GRIMSHAW: That's good.

ANGELA SCANLON: Again, I think it's a texture thing, maybe.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Maybe a texture thing, yeah-

ANGELA SCANLON: And also, it's filthy salty.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -with pork scratchings, it's salty, crunchy-

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -goodness.

ANGELA SCANLON: Man food.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Man food.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: It's all we eat. Um, on the drinks front, it's a fairly open bar here.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: Uh, we have quite the list. Margarita, Paloma, champagne, 1 or 2 cocktails on an empty stomach, home by 10. Used to drink, uh, Tia Maria with milk.

ANGELA SCANLON: Gross.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Whiskey was my tippie for many years, but you're civilised now.

ANGELA SCANLON: Mm-hm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Coconut water straight from a coconut, please.

ANGELA SCANLON: Thank you.

NICK GRIMSHAW: That's quite the order.

ANGELA SCANLON: It is quite the order.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And you like them all together?

ANGELA SCANLON: All at once.

NICK GRIMSHAW: All at once.

ANGELA SCANLON: On a tray.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, well, you do, because I always see you on Instagram having like potions and sort of elixirs or like a shake of some sort.

ANGELA SCANLON: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: What is your go-to? Because you always dabble in a different, you know, variety of wellness drinks.

ANGELA SCANLON: Well, I like a cacao-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yes.

ANGELA SCANLON: -a ceremonial grade cacao.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yes. What does that mean?

ANGELA SCANLON: It's basically hot chocolate for breakfast.

[crew laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Right, right. Okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: But you know, the vibes are high.

NICK GRIMSHAW: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay, stop looking at me. Um, it's my moment to go, thank you-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -I'll see you for the school run.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, okay. And so, would you have that like after school run?

ANGELA SCANLON: No, no, no.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Before.

ANGELA SCANLON: Before. Down the hatch.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Because it's like an upper.

ANGELA SCANLON: It's an upper.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And I always thought it wasn't. I always thought cacao was literally hot chocolate.

ANGELA SCANLON: Well, it depends.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: Because sometimes it can be, it's essentially heart-opening-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh.

ANGELA SCANLON: -whatever that means to you. So, it might make you feel a bit-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Uh-huh. Uh-huh.

ANGELA SCANLON: -wild-eyed if you're not used to it, or it might make you feel a bit like softer to the world-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh.

ANGELA SCANLON: -you know. So, it's not an upper in the way caffeine makes me-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Right, right, right.

ANGELA SCANLON: -a bit jittery.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Uh-huh, uh-huh.

ANGELA SCANLON: And let's be honest, I don't need that.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Right.

ANGELA SCANLON: And so, I find it like quite-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -grounding. And then I put like nutmeg-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and cinnamon-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and all sorts of bits and pieces in it.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh yeah, and you grate it, is that what you do? No?

ANGELA SCANLON: You blend it.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah, so I like, there's a whole fandango.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: So, it depends how much time you have.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: And whether, you know, you're preparing it with somebody else-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Uh-huh.

ANGELA SCANLON: -because you can like spoon intentionality into it. *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: Are you spooning intentionally back there, Ange?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, I'm spooning intentionally.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Good.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Very much so.

ANGELA SCANLON: She's got a spatula.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Good.

ANGELA SCANLON: She's spooning.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Spooning. Uh, let's go into your dislikes. Only one, and a common one. one, liver.

ANGELA SCANLON: Only one? Is that all I put on there?

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, you said-

ANGELA SCANLON: Look, I'm an open kind of gal.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah. Oh, and sweetbreads.

ANGELA SCANLON: And sweet, in the same vein, really. Organs.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, organs. No organs.

ANGELA SCANLON: I'm not into organs.

NICK GRIMSHAW: No. *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]* Um, I just remember liver being like a thing-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -at home-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and I can literally still, I can still smell it-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -right now when I say the word, like conjuring up like Bewitched.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah. What am I in, like a sort of pâté disguised?

ANGELA SCANLON: No, you're-

NICK GRIMSHAW: No.

ANGELA SCANLON: -having literally fried liver for your dinner, hun-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -with peas and carrots and a few spuds.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Like, not cute.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: That's instead of a mignon.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Fillet mignon.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: No, we did not have that.

[crew laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: No, no, no, not doing that.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]* We had liver, and it wasn't seasoned. Like, I'm sure there are magical ways-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yes.

ANGELA SCANLON: -that you can drown out the taste of that bad bitch.

NICK GRIMSHAW: *[laughs]*

[crew laughs]

ANGELA SCANLON: Do you know what I mean? Like marinate it-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -in something.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Something.

ANGELA SCANLON: But no-

NICK GRIMSHAW: No.

ANGELA SCANLON: -smells like the blood of a butcher's.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah. It's tough. It's tough. I reckon though, if you know your way around it, Ange.

ANGELA HARTNETT: I think you can.

NICK GRIMSHAW: You gotta make it.

ANGELA SCANLON: You can what!

ANGELA HARTNETT: You gotta cook it really quickly.

NICK GRIMSHAW: You can.

ANGELA SCANLON: You can what.

ANGELA HARTNETT: You can. You can have it with really beautiful, like slowly cooked onions and go, oh, you don't like onions, so it'd be no good for you, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Look, I ain't taking it from you, babe.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: But yeah, no, I know-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, 'cause I always-

ANGELA HARTNETT: -It's one thing. You love it or hate it.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -I always wanna have liver because everyone talks about how healthy it is and-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Didn't we have liver with um, Emma Barnett? We had offal with her one year.

NICK GRIMSHAW: We did, yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: She loves a bit of offal.

ANGELA SCANLON: By choice?

ANGELA HARTNETT: She chose, yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, that was her choice, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Wow.

NICK GRIMSHAW: She's keeping it real.

ANGELA SCANLON: Although weirdly, um, because the algorithm-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -knows me well, it served me this like thing which is essentially powdered offal. I now put that in my smoothies.

NICK GRIMSHAW: No.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: And it's a bit like-

ANGELA HARTNETT: 'Cause you want the protein.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and also the kind of like, I don't know, you know that lad who used to eat the steaks-

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: -ergh-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and the blood? Like, I don't know-

NICK GRIMSHAW: No.

ANGELA SCANLON: -I think it's probably paleo gone mad, right?

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: But I still think maybe, you know, we're people of the land.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, maybe we need that.

ANGELA SCANLON: We need a bit of blood.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: So-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Put powdered in a smoothie, please.

ANGELA SCANLON: Powdered in a smoothie-

[crew laughs]

ANGELA SCANLON: -with a little bit of maca.

NICK GRIMSHAW: In a smoothie please.

ANGELA SCANLON: Thank you so much.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Thank you. With a bit of maca, please.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: Now, when you wrote to us, you said that- You wrote to us?

ANGELA SCANLON: I loved that when you wrote to us.

NICK GRIMSHAW: When you wrote to us.

ANGELA SCANLON: Dear Nick and Angela-

NICK GRIMSHAW: And Angela.

[crew laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Thank you for offering a seat at the Dish Table.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: No, um, you said that you use olive oil on everything.

ANGELA SCANLON: Like, I glug it out of the bottle.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Everything. Are you, yeah, are you someone that just drinks it out of the bottle?

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: How are you doing that? Like a shot with stuff?

ANGELA SCANLON: Shot with stuff. Don't tell anyone at my house, but straight out of the bottle.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Wow.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh.

ANGELA SCANLON: So sometimes I'll do it with lemon, or yeah, mix it with lemon, but then I kind of think in hindsight that might be a little curdl-y.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And how often are you doing the shot? Every day?

ANGELA SCANLON: Every day.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Wow.

ANGELA SCANLON: Down the hatch in the morning.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Wow, you do look good.

ANGELA SCANLON: Thanks.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, I am influenced.

ANGELA SCANLON: Are you?

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: I think it's-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Do you fancy a shot, Ange, now?

ANGELA SCANLON: Come on.

ANGELA HARTNETT: I do a shot every morning.

ANGELA SCANLON: Do you?

NICK GRIMSHAW: No, you do not. Why have you never said?

[crew laughs]

ANGELA HARTNETT: I do, um, I do, um, ginger.

ANGELA SCANLON: Ginger, yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Ginger and turmeric.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yes.

ANGELA HARTNETT: And then when we were in Norway, no, Iceland, Neil and I were doing olive oil every day as well.

ANGELA SCANLON: So good.

NICK GRIMSHAW: What?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Or before everything. Before, no, well, no, first you have lemon water. Do you have lemon water?

ANGELA SCANLON: Lemon water, I don't.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Ah.

ANGELA SCANLON: 'Cause I actually think I'm a bit intolerant to lemon.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh no.

ANGELA SCANLON: So, I think I'm doing the whole thing.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: I'm like, you know, getting up early, having-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -gentle water on my stomach before coffee, whatever.
And then I just break out like a motherf*****.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh really?

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: I've, I've just put lemon in this. Are you gonna be all right?

ANGELA SCANLON: No, no, no, I'll be great.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh no, she'll be fine, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: Great, spot's the next thing.

ANGELA SCANLON: Nah, listen, you can't duck and dive and swerve lemon. Like, what is life without it?

NICK GRIMSHAW: No, yeah, but you don't need to be actively adding it to— Are you all right with that one there behind you? Is that all right?

[crew laughs]

ANGELA SCANLON: No, that's fine.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Is that all right? Ceramic.

[theme music plays]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Right, well, the food is here.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yes.

NICK GRIMSHAW: It smells delicious.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]* It does.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: It looks delicious too.

NICK GRIMSHAW: It looks so good. Tell us what we've got for our meal today on Dish.

ANGELA HARTNETT: We have an orzotto with bone broth, prawns, and peas.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh, yes.

ANGELA HARTNETT: And yeah, so basically lots of protein in there, bone broth. And I've made you a risotto because obviously orzo is pasta.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Thank you, Ange.

ANGELA SCANLON: Mm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: So, there you go.

ANGELA SCANLON: Our gluten-free queen.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, there we go.

NICK GRIMSHAW: So annoying. But thank you, Angela. Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh, the depth.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh, bless you.

[crew laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: The depth.

ANGELA HARTNETT: So, you basically start off, chop your fennel, really fine. Then in a pan, add your butter and then sauté off your fennel. And you can add shallot to this if you want to, but we've left that out for you. So, you've got your fennel, your fennel seeds in there, and you sauté them off with a bit of salt.

ANGELA SCANLON: I love fennel so much.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, until it becomes really, really soft. Then you stir in your orzo and fry that for 2 minutes. And then after you've fried that, you add your bone broth to it-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: -and then basically bring it up to a simmer and cook it for about 10 minutes, 10 to 12 minutes, until it's nice and silky and lovely, lovely and tender. And then you add half a lemon juice and then we stir through because again, we could have done— in this recipe, you put the garlic with the prawns separately, but as I know you don't like garlic, we've added the prawns in and the peas with the lemon juice and then finished it with a touch of butter, touch of Parmesan, some garlic, some parsley, and chopped fennel.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: It is sublime.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Angela, I love this.

ANGELA HARTNETT: You happy?

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh my God.

NICK GRIMSHAW: This is really, really good.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Add your extra olive oil.

ANGELA SCANLON: This is so good. Orzotto.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Orzotto.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Orzotto.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Orzotto. So, what is orzotto? Just an orzo variety?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Basically orzo. Yeah, no, no, it's-

NICK GRIMSHAW: It is the same?

ANGELA HARTNETT: -orzotto in the sense that It's cooked, finished like a risotto.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh. Orzotto, I see.

ANGELA HARTNETT: So, you had a little bit of butter in there.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Okay.

ANGELA HARTNETT: So, it's a bit of that, you know-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: -but basically orzo, um it's pasta.

ANGELA SCANLON: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And then you've made mine a risotto-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -'cause the gluten. But so that's the same, same-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Same principle.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -same principle.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah. Bone broth in there, yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: It's really delicious.

ANGELA SCANLON: It's absolutely gorgeous.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And did you like doing it with the bone broth?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: -I like, I mean, any risotto or orzo is as good as its broth.

ANGELA SCANLON: Mm-hm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: That's essentially it. So, you know, if you've had a bad risotto, it's because they haven't put the effort into the broth. That's what makes risotto.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: And nothing tastes better than bone broth, unlike a chicken stock. which cooks for a couple of hours. Bone broth is like 24 hours.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: You know, get all that collagen out, and that's why it's really good for you. And that's why you see it everywhere now-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: -because everyone's just drinking it by the gallon.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: I do it every week.

ANGELA HARTNETT: It's the best thing.

NICK GRIMSHAW: No, it's so good, this, Angela. Thank you.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Thank you. Pleasure.

ANGELA SCANLON: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Absolutely delicious.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Really tasty. There's a wine pairing as well.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, what have we got?

NICK GRIMSHAW: Um, it's from Puglia, and it's a bright, minerally Italian white wine.

ANGELA SCANLON: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: It's an organic Fiano.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: That's delicious wine.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Goes well with it.

ANGELA SCANLON: It's delicious.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Really great with it.

ANGELA SCANLON: Everything.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Well, you can try this recipe, uh, or get the ingredients or get the wine pairing, [waitrose.com/dishrecipes](https://www.waitrose.com/dishrecipes), they are all on there. Um, and this is really good. I really like this. Thank you, Angela.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Pleasure.

ANGELA SCANLON: It's absolutely beautiful.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Delicious.

[theme music plays]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Um, Angela-

ANGELA SCANLON: Yes.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -shall we talk to you about your podcasts-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yes.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -on our podcast?

ANGELA SCANLON: Yes, let's do.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Um, you have a brand new one-

ANGELA SCANLON: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -called Gift List.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: This is basically where you're joined by a celebrity guest, and you speak to the guest about the best and worst gifts that they've given and received.

ANGELA SCANLON: Given and received.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yes.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah. So, first guest, Louis Theroux. Out the blocks.

NICK GRIMSHAW: No pressure.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Do you know what I mean? I was like, boom, what a booking.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: That's magical. And then I thought, s***.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Louis Theroux.

ANGELA SCANLON: It's Louis Theroux

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Like, he was on here. Did you, did you feel any of that?

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yes, definitely.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yes, big pressure.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm, mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah

ANGELA SCANLON: I was like, oh, and also, he sets the pace-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -like, he's not matching you-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -he's not responding. He's like—

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm, mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: He's slightly controlling it all.

ANGELA SCANLON: Totally.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: You think you're-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -in the hot seat.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: You think you're driving it.

NICK GRIMSHAW: We don't even know what we asked.

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah. We're just like, yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: You tell us, Louis.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, you tell us, we'll ask it. Yeah. But how was, how was Lou? Because we did have, I did feel scared.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Definitely felt scared.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: But then once it-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Once, yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -we were, I had a really nice time.

ANGELA HARTNETT: He was brilliant.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And he was really silly.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: He's a lot sillier than I thought.

ANGELA SCANLON: He's really silly.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: And he's like glinty.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: You know, there's a real spark and a real-

NICK GRIMSHAW: And there's a-

ANGELA SCANLON: -yeah. Ooh!

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Um, yeah, so I really, I really, I loved it.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: And he obviously has so many stories.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yes.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: I mean, stealing things from Joan Collins. *[laughs]* I said things-

NICK GRIMSHAW: What?

ANGELA SCANLON: -which makes it sound like he literally goes to famous people's houses and fills his bag-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -while he's in there. But he was invited to a Christmas party-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and got caught on the way out the door with cutlery in his-

NICK GRIMSHAW: No.

ANGELA HARTNETT: No.

ANGELA SCANLON: -pocke. Mm-hm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: From Joan Collins?

ANGELA SCANLON: From Joan Collins.

ANGELA HARTNETT: How was that? What did he get caught, were they searching bags and stuff? Or what?

ANGELA SCANLON: No, but the spoon was sticking out of his arse pocket.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh, that-

NICK GRIMSHAW: No!

ANGELA HARTNETT: -poor, poor.

ANGELA SCANLON: Rookie error-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Bad error.

ANGELA SCANLON: -if you're trying to get the cutlery-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -you know. Deep bag-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Uh-huh.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -surely. Um, and she sent her sister-in-law after him.

NICK GRIMSHAW: No.

ANGELA SCANLON: She was like, "Louis!"

NICK GRIMSHAW: No.

ANGELA SCANLON: He didn't realise. He had like tucked it away for pudding-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh!

ANGELA SCANLON: -later.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh-

NICK GRIMSHAW: He wasn't actually.

ANGELA HARTNETT: -he wasn't actually.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I was gonna say, why didn't he?

ANGELA SCANLON: The intention wasn't there-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Right, it wasn't

ANGELA HARTNETT: So, he says.

ANGELA SCANLON: -at least that's his story and he's sticking to it.

NICK GRIMSHAW: That's his story.

ANGELA HARTNETT: So, he says yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I saw a celebrity once drop their bag at an event and loads of cutlery and a plate came out.

ANGELA HARTNETT: No.

ANGELA SCANLON: Shut up.

[crew laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: And they were like; “I don't know how that happened.”

ANGELA SCANLON: Shut up.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I was like, “I do. You put them in your bag.”

[crew laughs]

ANGELA SCANLON: You scooped the dinner plate in.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Spoon's one thing, but a whole cutlery set.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Loads. Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Wow.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Wow.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Where would you steal from?

NICK GRIMSHAW: I was quite a, I was, where, what?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, but-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Where would I steal from?

ANGELA SCANLON: Where would you steal something?

ANGELA HARTNETT: If you went to Buckingham Palace, would you try and steal something?

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh, listen, I'd be very tempted to.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

[crew laughs]

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]* You see, you would.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]* You know you wouldn't, like, they've plenty to go-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -around too.

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: Do you know what I mean?

NICK GRIMSHAW: They won't mind.

ANGELA SCANLON: I feel like their sets have a few spares. Yeah

NICK GRIMSHAW: I reckon they give like, they're not using their like dead nice stuff with us.

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: I bet it's like the costumes jewellery—

ANGELA SCANLON: Dead nice stuff.

[crew laughs]

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]* Dead nice stuff.

NICK GRIMSHAW: They're not.

ANGELA SCANLON: Like a little tea cosy or like a knitted like, I bet they would have-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -a kind of frothy doily-shaped-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -like, loo roll cover-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm, mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -that I would take.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Anyway, the podcast isn't What Would You Nick?

[crew laughs]

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah sorry.

NICK GRIMSHAW: It's-

ANGELA SCANLON: But it should be!

NICK GRIMSHAW: -It should be!

ANGELA HARTNETT: Anyway, for your next one. Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Hello, new podcast idea!

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: What Would You Nick?

ANGELA SCANLON: Give guest what?

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Get in my bag!

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah. *[laughs]* and doesn't he tell a great story about Tom Cruise?

ANGELA SCANLON: Tom Cruise.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Because he likes to gift.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Tom Cruise is a notorious gifter, apparently-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah. *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: -and heard whispers through Justin Theroux-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -presumably.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: I think he says it a slightly different way. Louis is like, oh, he's gone all American, he says [*in an American accent*] 'Theroux'.

NICK GRIMSHAW: [*in an American accent*] 'Theroux'.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Theroux.

ANGELA SCANLON: Whereas, you know, the family is Theroux.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: And anyway, so Justin was filming with Tom Cruise and said, my granny, who also happens to be Louis' granny-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -is turning 100. He gets a call, and the granny's like, "I just got 100 cupcakes." She probably doesn't sound like that, but—

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: "From a lovely fella-

NICK GRIMSHAW: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: -that Justin works with works with, Tom!" And Louis was like, "Tom who?" And she's like, "I don't know, Tom Cruise."

NICK GRIMSHAW: No.

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: Shut up. A, you do know who it is-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and B, 100 cupcakes. I mean, she's not going to eat them at 100.

ANGELA HARTNETT: No.

NICK GRIMSHAW: No.

ANGELA SCANLON: Do you know what I mean?

NICK GRIMSHAW: No, I love *[laughs]*

ANGELA HARTNETT: She'll eat one, I'm sure. *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: Half of one.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Nans love to eat half.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah. *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: A half.

[crew laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: You know who else does a gift, is Elton John-

ANGELA SCANLON: Does he?

NICK GRIMSHAW: -and he has a full-time-

ANGELA SCANLON: Gifting person.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Gifting Person.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -a gifting person-

ANGELA SCANLON: Shut up.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -and they buy gifts.

ANGELA SCANLON: What a gig.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -for Elton John. What a job. What do you do? Buy loads of stuff.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh my God.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I would love that.

ANGELA SCANLON: Embroidered s***.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Like, is he doing monogram? I feel like he's quite a thoughtful gifter.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Everyone, I think, gets the same-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Gift.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -like sort of area. So, it's like a champagne and a photograph-

ANGELA SCANLON: Ah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -or like, you know-

ANGELA SCANLON: And then it's different.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -a vintage red wine and a painting or whatever-

ANGELA SCANLON: Aw.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -but it's all different, but everyone gets like the same thing.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah. Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh okay.

ANGELA HARTNETT: That's same era.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, we need to get on that list. We should get him on here.
We need to get on that list.

ANGELA HARTNETT: I'm surprised you're not on that list.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I know-

ANGELA HARTNETT: He sent us both his records.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -I've interviewed him, twice.

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh, oh.

[crew laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Get me on the list.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: And what do you think you did wrong?

NICK GRIMSHAW: I don't know.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yes.

NICK GRIMSHAW: The first time is a junket, so you won't get on the list.

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay, no, no, no.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yes.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Second time I went to his house.

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, that was a big one, yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: So you should be on the list.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I actually took him a f***** present.

[crew laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: What do you think is like the best gift that you've ever received? What is, or maybe like the best sort of birthday memory or Christmas present that you remember ever getting?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh, my brother did a brilliant one when we first got our first dog. We had this dog Alfie that we were all in love with, and he bought this cushion which was in the shape of a Chanel perfume bottle, and it said Chew-nel on it. So, it's basically this dog cushion with 'Chew-nel' on it.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh my God.

ANGELA SCANLON: Aw.

ANGELA HARTNETT: And it was brilliant. It was a brilliant gift for Alfie-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Aw.

ANGELA HARTNETT: -and we still have the cushion. It's great. Yeah, that's a good one. That was a great, that was thoughtful. He'd thought that out well for it.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Uh-huh.

ANGELA SCANLON: That's good.

ANGELA HARTNETT: That was good gift yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: What about you, Angela? Have you been wowed by any gifts?

ANGELA SCANLON: My husband is like really good at gifts.

ANGELA HARTNETT: That's great.

NICK GRIMSHAW: That's good.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Do you feel the pressure then to buy it when you—

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Which sometimes just leads to me being paralysed, when it comes to gifting.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yes.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yes.

ANGELA SCANLON: So, I had bought this ring essentially—

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -for 12 quid, loved it. It tarnished; it went green—

NICK GRIMSHAW: Uh-huh.

ANGELA SCANLON: -it turned my finger green.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Then I bought it at half price, 6 quid. Thank you very much.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: She likes a bargain. And then I remember saying to him, “Oh, I really love this ring, and I wish that it was a real ring-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -so that I could keep it forever.”

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: And he took like the discarded little green tarnished one and had it moulded into it.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Aw.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Ah, that's good.

ANGELA HARTNETT: That's a great gift.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Thoughtful.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, very cute.

ANGELA SCANLON: Really thoughtful.

NICK GRIMSHAW: That's really good. I remember the first Christmas me and Mesh were together; I came downstairs on, it was Christmas time. I came downstairs on December 1st, and we'd been together like a few months. And when I came downstairs, there was 25 presents out. So, it was a present for every day.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Aw.

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh, like an advent calendar.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Like an advent of presents.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh, that's lovely.

NICK GRIMSHAW: So, I was like, f***** hell.

[everyone laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Because it's not only all wrapped up-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -they were interconnected.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh.

NICK GRIMSHAW: So, like one made sense with 3-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -and then 7 or something. That made sense.

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh.

ANGELA HARTNETT: A lot of pressure there.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I really thought out. And I was like, “Got you a jumper!”

[everyone laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: “Got you John Lewis vouchers.” Do you know what I mean, like ugh.

ANGELA SCANLON: I bought my husband a, um, letter opener.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh. *[laughs]*

ANGELA HARTNETT: Okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: Livid.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Livid.

ANGELA SCANLON: Absolutely livid.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah

NICK GRIMSHAW: I think that's quite fab.

ANGELA SCANLON: I thought so too.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: I was imagining him at a, like, a leather-clad desk.

NICK GRIMSHAW: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: I don't know who I thought he was, Gordon Gekko.

[everyone laughs]

ANGELA SCANLON: I was like “Oh, I bought you a letter opener.”

NICK GRIMSHAW: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: He's like, “What the f*** is that? Like a toothpick?”

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: Like a big pick? He's like, “Okay, sorry-

NICK GRIMSHAW: All the letters that we get.

ANGELA SCANLON: -how old do you think I am?” I was like, “It's fab! Look at it! You just whip open the bills.”

[everyone laughs]

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Anyway, we still have it. He whipped it out of the drawer the other day. It's not, it shouldn't live with-

NICK GRIMSHAW: No.

ANGELA SCANLON: -the spatulas-

ANGELA HARTNETT: No.

ANGELA SCANLON: -frankly.

NICK GRIMSHAW: No, it should be on his leather clad desk.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yes. *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: Sure.

NICK GRIMSHAW: In Mad Men. Yeah. *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: Exactly.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Where he lives.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Exactly.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: It's out right now. It is!

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Wherever you buy your podcasts-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh yes.

ANGELA SCANLON: -YouTube, all the usual shenanigans.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Everywhere.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Shenanigans, I love it.

ANGELA SCANLON: Merci beaucoup.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Well, I can't wait to check out the Louis one.

ANGELA SCANLON: Thank you.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Can't wait to see.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, that will be fun.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And then who's number 2? A mystery.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: A mystery. Also, alongside Gift List, we also have Get a Grip-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: We do.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -with you and Vicky.

ANGELA SCANLON: Different flavour.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Different flavour.

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: Very different flavour. Very different flavour. But I did a job with her, and we had a really fun time on a TV show together.

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh, you did?

NICK GRIMSHAW: It was really fun.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: I loved that show.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And she was great to go to work with.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah, she's fantastic.

NICK GRIMSHAW: You must have a nice time with her.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: She's funny and she's charming. And she's-

NICK GRIMSHAW: She's really funny. Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -gobby.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yes.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Exactly how I like them.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And she's on it.

ANGELA SCANLON: Totally.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: She's brilliant. And I mean, it's very different from Gift List.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: It's like the group chat opened up-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yes.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and all of the-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -you know, directions that you go in.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: For good or bad.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And I guess you can sort of talk about absolutely anything on that.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And you do.

ANGELA HARTNETT: We do.

NICK GRIMSHAW: *[laughs]* And you do.

ANGELA SCANLON: We absolutely do.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And you do, yeah.

[theme music plays]

NICK GRIMSHAW: We should talk about Strictly 'cause it's Strictly season.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And it's also, you know, the time of year where we're always like, Angela, you should have done Strictly.

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: Yes.

NICK GRIMSHAW: You should have done it. And Angela, you've been asked.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yes. And I've said no. *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: You've said no. Well, to be fair, you do have—

ANGELA HARTNETT: Other things to do.

[crew laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: *[sighs]* A lot of restaurants to run.

ANGELA HARTNETT: I mean if I said yes to—

NICK GRIMSHAW: Lots of things to run.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]*

ANGELA HARTNETT: -Strictly, Sam would never forgive me.

NICK GRIMSHAW: No, Sam would never forgive you.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Because dates.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I'm always like, "Why don't we do another Dish live? Or why don't we do a Dish thing?" And Sam's like, "When's Angela got a day off?"

[everyone laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: She hasn't. So, you can-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Can you imagine if I did Strictly and Sam the whole of, and did well? Can you imagine that?

NICK GRIMSHAW: Can imagine.

[everyone laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, we'd want you to do it just for a week. Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Just one week.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Just a week.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Get kicked off.

ANGELA SCANLON: I think you'd do very well.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Do you think?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: What would be your sell? What do you think was the best bit about it for you?

ANGELA SCANLON: Like, it's absolute madness-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and I turned it down a few times before because I was like, I don't know if-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -you want to go into that. Like, it's a lot.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Um, but I honestly, like, it's absolutely terrifying.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: And I think sometimes—

NICK GRIMSHAW: Not selling it.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]* Sorry.

NICK GRIMSHAW: *[laughs]*

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: Full stop.

ANGELA SCANLON: No, no, I'm getting there. Um-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -that actually, I think as you get older, there are fewer things that frighten the living daylights-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -out of you.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: And that actually, it really makes you feel alive. *[laughs]*

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: And it's kind of wonderful.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: I mean, I get it, you've got like multiple-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -restaurants, the tango-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -I don't know how much you can pour into that.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: You know what I mean?

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: But I think you'd be f*****fabulous.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Aw, thank you.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yes.

ANGELA SCANLON: Absolutely fabulous.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Thank you, Angela, that's sweet.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Maybe next year.

ANGELA SCANLON: So, when they asked you-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Maybe next year.

ANGELA SCANLON: -what did you say?

ANGELA HARTNETT: No.

ANGELA SCANLON: I heard you skipped the country.

[crew laughs]

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: She did.

ANGELA SCANLON: Which is a pretty, like-

NICK GRIMSHAW: She went to Peru.

ANGELA SCANLON: -extreme reaction

ANGELA HARTNETT: I was just out. Oh yeah, I went to Peru.

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: I was having, I was doing a walking tour for charity in Uruguay-

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay.

ANGELA HARTNETT: -and I said, I'm in Peru walking.

ANGELA SCANLON: That's great.

ANGELA HARTNETT: I can't do it.

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I mean-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, you got to.

ANGELA SCANLON: For 6 months?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah 6- *[laughs]*

[crew laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, yeah. She's a slow walker.

ANGELA SCANLON: She's big on charity.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, she walked-

ANGELA HARTNETT: I did yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -the length of Peru.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah. *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: So, she couldn't do it.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh, do you know what? We got off the tube the other day actually in New York, and when we came out, there was like a, uh, like 3 floors up or something, like a couple having a dance lesson.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh, wow.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And we like stopped and watched them. It was like the Fred Astaire Dance Studios-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh wow.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -or something.

ANGELA SCANLON: Aw.

NICK GRIMSHAW: And for a moment I was like, oh, maybe I'll have a little, and then I was like, no.

ANGELA HARTNETT: No. *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mesh was like, forget it.

ANGELA SCANLON: Forget it.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I'd have to do, I'd have to have like 2 years on it.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: My coordination-

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: -awful.

ANGELA SCANLON: Really?

NICK GRIMSHAW: I think I'd struggle.

ANGELA HARTNETT: I think you'd be better than you think.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I'd be struggling. Yeah, yeah

ANGELA SCANLON: I bet you would.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, her would

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm don't know.

ANGELA HARTNETT: I've always said I'll do it if Nick does it. So, there you go.

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay, in the same year.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: But I am calling b***** on that because-

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: No.

ANGELA HARTNETT: That's true.

ANGELA SCANLON: As I heard, you won't do The Wheel on a joint seat.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: She won't do The Wheel in a joint seat. How do you know that?

ANGELA SCANLON: I heard it on the grapevine.

NICK GRIMSHAW: She won't do The Wheel on a joint seat.

ANGELA SCANLON: Angela!

ANGELA HARTNETT: How does she know all this about me?

NICK GRIMSHAW: How do you know that?

ANGELA SCANLON: I do my research too.

[everyone laughs]

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, you really do. God-

NICK GRIMSHAW: I wish you'd do-

ANGELA HARTNETT: -I've gone on the One Show, I've done that.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: I wish you'd do a Wheel on a joint seat.

ANGELA HARTNETT: No, I'd feel-

NICK GRIMSHAW: The Wheel!

ANGELA HARTNETT: -come on this question

ANGELA SCANLON: Honestly.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Please.

ANGELA SCANLON: Do it.

ANGELA HARTNETT: No, I don't like the pressure.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I'd prefer to see you on The Wheel than Strictly if I'm honest.

ANGELA SCANLON: So, would I.

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

[crew laughs]

ANGELA SCANLON: So, would I.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I think you'd love the wheel.

ANGELA SCANLON: Because also you gotta do this.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah. Whoo

ANGELA SCANLON: To the old Go-Pro, hey girl!

NICK GRIMSHAW: Whoo.

ANGELA SCANLON: Whoo.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh yeah that's worse.

ANGELA HARTNETT: And that's the very reason alone I'll never do it.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: *[laughs]*

[crew laughs]

ANGELA HARTNETT: I mean, honestly, if you are selling it to me, that has failed. Oh my God, no.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I love The Wheel.

ANGELA SCANLON: I love The Wheel too.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I love The Wheel.

ANGELA SCANLON: Although I have-

ANGELA HARTNETT: You do The Wheel. Have you done The Wheel?

ANGELA SCANLON: -been-

NICK GRIMSHAW: I won The Wheel, I beat Carol Vorderman.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Well, done.

[gasp]

NICK GRIMSHAW: She's a big thicko in real life!

[everyone laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Smashed it. She was like—

[everyone laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: I did, I beat her.

ANGELA SCANLON: You did not.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I did!

ANGELA SCANLON: That really sent me.

[theme music plays]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Okay, Angela Scanlon—

ANGELA SCANLON: Yes.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -it is time for your fast food—

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -quiz.

ANGELA SCANLON: Hit me.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Please tell us—

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -your favourite way to eat eggs.

ANGELA SCANLON: Starting as fried, ending as scrambled.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Okay.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: So, like in a pan, hot pan-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -loads of butter, whack them in-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and then let them start to fry around the edges and then start whipping them.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh, yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh, okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: So, they're kind of-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Crispy and soft as well.

ANGELA SCANLON: Mm.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Okay, I get that. Favourite sandwich filling?

ANGELA SCANLON: Cheese. Horgan's cheese specifically.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Okay, nice.

ANGELA SCANLON: Wexford cheddar.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Lovely.

NICK GRIMSHAW: What is your favourite form of potato?

ANGELA SCANLON: I- I- It'd be like picking a favourite child.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Pick a favourite child.

[crew laughs]

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Do it.

ANGELA SCANLON: -mashed potatoes with loads of butter, milk, and peas.

NICK GRIMSHAW: yes.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh nice.

ANGELA SCANLON: That was my like childhood.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh, love that.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Um, what's your favourite item on a barbecue?

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh, um, oh-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh, oh Angela.

ANGELA SCANLON: On a barbecue?

NICK GRIMSHAW: On a barbecue!

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh, I quite like all the bits around the barbecue-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: -rather than the actual slabs of meat.

ANGELA HARTNETT: All the dips and stuff. Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh, and the coleslaws-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and all the breads and all that.

ANGELA HARTNETT: The corn and all that. That's all right-

ANGELA SCANLON: Corn, corn

NICK GRIMSHAW: Corn.

ANGELA HARTNETT: -we'll accept that.

ANGELA SCANLON: Let's do corn.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Corn.

ANGELA SCANLON: Loads of butter, corn.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Corn.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, gotta be, yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: What do you think is the best crisp?

ANGELA SCANLON: The best crisp-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -is a Meanie.

NICK GRIMSHAW: What's a Meanie?

ANGELA SCANLON: I don't know.

NICK GRIMSHAW: What?

ANGELA SCANLON: *[laughs]*

[crew laughs]

ANGELA SCANLON: What do you mean, what's a Meanie?

NICK GRIMSHAW: Is that the brand?

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah, it's a crisp.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Okay, I've never heard that.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I've never heard of a Meanie.

ANGELA SCANLON: I mean, it's like, stop looking at me like that.

[crew laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Do you know a meanie?

PRODUCER TOM: Niall, Niall Horan said that.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Does Niall like a Meanie?

ANGELA SCANLON: Does he? Oh, see, it must be an Irish-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Irish taste, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: It tastes delicious.

ANGELA HARTNETT: If Niall has it.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Delicious.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: Salt and vinegar and like kind of curdled little, like texturally, I'd say in that-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: -space.

ANGELA HARTNETT: All right. Okay.

NICK GRIMSHAW: All right. Shout out meanies.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah. What's your favourite kitchen utensil?

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh, is it appliance or utensil?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Either.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay, I have a travel blender-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Oh.

ANGELA SCANLON: -that I would actually go to war for.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Wow.

ANGELA HARTNETT: So, you take it with you?

ANGELA SCANLON: You charge it up.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: You charge it up with a, like, iPhone charger-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -and then, yeah, whip it up, have a little smoothie as you go, stick all the stuff into it.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh.

ANGELA SCANLON: Zzzz. In the, sorry. *[laughs]*

[everyone laughs]

ANGELA HARTNETT: In the comfort of your own hotel room.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yeah, yeah, yeah. Wherever, in a lift-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah, yeah. *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: -wherever ever you like.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Whatever you do.

ANGELA SCANLON: Anytime.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh, they were tough. Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

[theme music plays]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Angela, we come to the end of the show question-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: -for your chance to win this Waitrose goodie bag here-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: You know what I mean.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Unbelievable.

ANGELA SCANLON: I'm going to send you one of them.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Thank you.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -because you need to see it in the edges.

NICK GRIMSHAW: You need to see it, okay.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah, yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: We need to see whether there are any little nibbles-

ANGELA HARTNETT: Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm-hm.

ANGELA SCANLON: -of pastry.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Okay, okay. she's talking a look.

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh, look, it's got little a eyes!

NICK GRIMSHAW: Okay, there we go.

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: That feels to me quite-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA SCANLON: How do you feel about that, Ange?

NICK GRIMSHAW: I feel like that's quite good. Mm-hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: I like the weight-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Mm.

ANGELA HARTNETT: -like that, yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I think this is good, guys.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Good technique there, good technique.

NICK GRIMSHAW: I think we're on a 50-50 here.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Let's see. Angela-

[crew laughs]

ANGELA SCANLON: Aw f*** luck. Hang tight, hang tight.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Okay-

ANGELA SCANLON: There we go.

[crew laughs]

ANGELA HARTNETT: -so which, that's for me. Yeah?

ANGELA SCANLON: That's belonging to that.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Okay. Here we go, here we go, Okay.

ANGELA SCANLON: That's belonging to that.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Alright

NICK GRIMSHAW: Angela, you ready to weigh?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Ready yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay, go on.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Okay, I'm getting over here. 244.

ANGELA SCANLON: *[gasps]*

ANGELA HARTNETT: 233.

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Very close.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Close

ANGELA HARTNETT: Very close.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Close, close, close.

ANGELA SCANLON: Is that close?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Very close.

ANGELA SCANLON: We don't really have anything to work from.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Its close. Okay, that's actually a pass.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Okay.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Do a kiwi.

ANGELA SCANLON: She's pretty symmetrical. I like it. I feel like this might be a golden one.

ANGELA HARTNETT: How much fruit can you keep looking at!

NICK GRIMSHAW: Okay, where you going next?

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay moving on.

NICK GRIMSHAW: You can't have fruit again. One more, one more, one more.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Okay, okay.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Let's do the hat trick. Come on, what are you gonna go for?

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay, I'm gonna go for butter.

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh.

ANGELA HARTNETT: -118.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh.

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay. Oh, sorry. Jesus.

[crew laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Oh.

[everyone laughs]

NICK GRIMSHAW: Boo! Get her off. Get her out of here.

ANGELA SCANLON: Out?

ANGELA HARTNETT: Good game.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Very good game. Good game.

ANGELA SCANLON: Good game.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Good game, good game.

[applause]

NICK GRIMSHAW: The goodie bag is yours.

ANGELA SCANLON: Yay. Yay.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Here's the goodie bag.

ANGELA SCANLON: Aw, thank you.

NICK GRIMSHAW: *[laughs]*

ANGELA SCANLON: Oh, she's heavy. Wow.

ANGELA HARTNETT: Take these varieties as well.

ANGELA SCANLON: Okay, yeah-

NICK GRIMSHAW: Yeah.

ANGELA SCANLON: -chuck them all in.

ANGELA HARTNETT: *[laughs]*

NICK GRIMSHAW: I just want a bit of that *[laughs]* Scotch egg.

[everyone laughs]

[theme music plays]

ANGELA SCANLON: That was actually a really good spatula there.

[everyone laughs]

ANGELA SCANLON: Thank you so much, guys.

NICK GRIMSHAW: Angela Scanlon, everybody!

ANGELA SCANLON: Thank you!

[cheering and applause]
